Bowel Cancer Screening

No-one wants to hear they have cancer - and often the fear of such news might make us hesitant to take part in cancer screening. The main aim of NHS cancer screening is to pick up abnormal cells BEFORE cancer even develops, and if there is cancer, for this to be at an early and curable stage. Regular screening every 2 years makes this more likely to succeed. So having the test will not make you more likely to have cancer, but it will give you a much better chance of preventing and surviving it.



Bowel cancer screening now uses a very simple stick test, for most people just a single test that you post back in a pre-paid envelope.

The stick tests for tiny amounts of blood hidden in the poo - if it is positive, you then have a telescope test to look for the cause of bleeding. Often, this is due to bowel wear and tear, but if a polyp is found this can be tested for abnormal cells. Sometimes, the pre-cancer is removed at the telescope test and no other treatment may be needed!

Bowel cancers usually develop very slowly from abnormal polyps that often leak blood- this is why regular screening tests can help *prevent* cancer, or pick it up in the very *early stages*. If an established cancer is discovered, we know that survival is 95% (19/20 people) if picked up at the earliest stage.

People aged 50-74 are automatically sent a postal kit. Please do the test and return it to give yourself the best chances of avoiding bowel cancer- the 3rd most common cancer in the UK.

If you have missed a test and now wish to participate, call 0800 707 60 60 to request a kit, or discuss with an advisor. If you are over 75, you can choose to 'opt-in' for extended bowel cancer screening, by phoning this same number. Alternatively, you could discuss further with a Nurse or GP at Haltwhistle Medical Group, or with Kathryn Samson, our care coordinator, about this or any of the other screening programmes on 01434 320077

IMPORTANT- If you have, or develop, blood in your poo, tummy pains or a change in your bowel habit then you must see your GP even if you have recently had negative bowel screening.
